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- 1839 On March 23rd, the initials "O.K." are first published in the Boston Morning Post. Used as an abbreviation for "oll korrect" which was a popular slang misspelling of "all correct" the word "Ok" slowly made its way into the vocabulary of all Americans.
- 1862 On March 9th, during the American Civil War, the ironclads Monitor and Virginia (formerly Merrimack) battled in the harbour at Hampton Roads, Virginia, marking the beginning of a new era of naval warfare.
- On March 3rd, the Star-Spangled 1931 Banner, written by Francis Scott Key during the War of 1812, was officially adopted as the national anthem of the United States by an act of Congress.
- On March 1st, President John F. Kennedy 1961 founded the Peace Corps. It is a successful volunteer organization that has since sent at least 235,000 Americans abroad to developing countries to help with health care, education, and other humanitarian needs.
- 2007 On March 1st, a detachment of 170 Swiss infantrymen accidentally invaded neighboring Liechtenstein when they got lost on a training mission. Luckily, after explaining the mistake to Liechtenstein, the Swiss army was given directions and returned home safely.
