Dates in History

1793 On November 8th, after more than two centuries as a royal palace, the Louvre is opened as a public museum in Paris by the French revolutionary government. Today, the Louvre's collection is one of the richest in the world, with artwork and artifacts representative of 11,000 years of human civilization and culture.

1944 On November 7th, Franklin D. Roosevelt was reelected president of the United States for a record third time, becoming the first and only president in history to win a fourth term in office.

On November 9th, the second-ranked Notre 1946 Dame Fighting Irish and the first-ranked Army Cadets played to a historic 0-0 tie at Yankee Stadium in New York. Notre Dame-Army was college football's biggest rivalry, and more than 74,000 people crowded the stands. At a time when football tickets typically cost \$1 to \$5, many fans had paid scalpers as much as \$250 for their seats. The game had been sold out since June of that year.

On November 2nd, The Hughes Flying Boat (a.k.a. Spruce Goose, H-4 Hercules), the largest wingspan aircraft ever built, was piloted by designer Howard Hughes on its first and only flight. Built with laminated birch and spruce, the massive wooden aircraft had a wingspan longer than a football field and was designed to carry more than 700 men to battle.

On November 5th, George Foreman, age 45, 1994 became boxing's oldest heavyweight champion when he defeated 26-year-old Michael Moorer in the 10th round of their WBA fight in Las Vegas, Nevada.
