### Dates in History

- 1921 On December 9th, a young engineer at General Motors named Thomas Midgeley Jr. discovered that when he added a compound called tetraethyl lead (TEL) to gasoline, he eliminated the unpleasant noises (known as "knock" or "pinging") that internal-combustion engines make when they run.
- 1975 On December 2nd, Ohio State University running back Archie Griffin became the first player in history to win the Heisman Trophy two years in a row.
- **1993** On December 8th, the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) was signed into law by President Bill Clinton. Clinton said he hoped the agreement would encourage other nations to work toward a broader worldtrade pact. NAFTA, a trade pact between the United States, Canada, and Mexico, eliminated virtually all tariffs and trade restrictions between the three nations.
