Dates in History

- 1883 On February 5th, the Southern Pacific Railroad completed its transcontinental "Sunset Route" from New Orleans to California, consolidating its dominance over rail traffic to the Pacific.
- 1903 On February 15th, toy store owner and inventor, Morris Michtom, placed two stuffed bears in his show window advertising them as Teddy Bears. Michtom had earlier petitioned President Theodore Roosevelt for permission to use his nickname, Teddy. The president agreed and before long, other toy manufactureres began turning out copies of Michtom's stuffed bears.
- 1929 On February 14th, Sir Alexander Fleming, a young bacteriologist, accidentally discovered penicillin. Having left a plate of staphylococcus bacteria uncovered, Fleming noticed that a mold had fallen on the culture and killed many of the bacteria.
- 1942 On February 9th, Congress pushed ahead standard time for the United States by one hour in each time zone, imposing daylight saving time-called at the time "war time." Daylight saving time, suggested by

President Roosevelt, was imposed to conserve fuel, and can be traced back to World War I, when Congress imposed a standard time on the United States to enable the country to better utilize resources.
